



Veteran Horse Society – AREA QUALIFIER 2026.

First round qualifier for the Veteran Horse Society Supreme Final:
VETERAN HORSE OF THE YEAR 2026
Kindly Sponsored by Allen & Page.

Open to members and non-members. All competitors and grooms must adhere to VHS Rules in all circumstances. Failure to do so may result in immediate disqualification. Those wishing to join or renew the Society will need to apply for this before 1st July each year or a late penalty fee of £15 will be charged.

VHS Regional Final qualification. All competitors placed 1st to 4th in each Area Qualifier class will qualify for the corresponding class at VHS Regional Finals. Members must carry their card in the ring at all times and have their showing card signed by the judge as proof of qualification. Non-members will receive a red qualification card which can be exchanged for signed showing card when applying for VHS membership, this MUST be done within 21 days of qualification. It is the competitors' responsibility to present their Showing card to the judge.

Regional Finals are open to members only.

All competitors are eligible to enter open classes at the National Veteran Championships, Arena UK, Lincolnshire, 4th-6th September 2026. No qualification or membership necessary. See VHS website for schedule which is available mid season in 2026.

Equifest Championships Qualification

Classes marked with * are all qualifiers for this years Equifest Championships

This Show is affiliated to Equifest, taking place at Arena UK, Grantham, Lincolnshire on the 5th – 8th August 2026.

The two highest exhibits not already qualified in each affiliated class will qualify.

Concours d'Elegance of Great Britain Qualification

Classes marked “ are qualifiers for the Concours d'Elegance Championships

1st - 3rd placed horses/ponies not already qualified will qualify for the Champion of Britain Title classes to be held at Onley Equestrian Centre on 25th & 26th September 2026. If a horse/pony has already qualified, cards may be handed down to 6th place at judge's discretion. Each qualified horse/pony will receive a qualification card in the ring which will enable the owner to enter the Championship Show, provided the owner and rider/handler are, or become registered with the Concours d'Elegance Society within 21 days of the qualifying show. No horse registration is required.

Class 7* - IN HAND COLOURED HORSE/PONY

Open in Hand Piebald / Skewbald stallion, mare, colt, filly or gelding, any age. The first three places will also qualify for the BSPA Championships subject to their show rules & conditions

Class 8 - TSR COLOURED HORSE/PONY RIDDEN AMATEUR OF THE YEAR**

Ponies: Open Ridden Piebald/Skewbald, stallion, mare or gelding 4 years and over. Riders any age except for those on stallions who must have attained their 14th birthday by 1st January of the current year. Spurs must not be worn. Ponies under 153cms.

Horses: Open Ridden Piebald/Skewbald, stallion, mare or gelding 4 years and over. Riders any age except for those on stallions who must have attained their 14th birthday by 1st January of the current year. Spurs may be worn by adult riders. Animals 153cms and over.

Class 9 - TSR RIDDEN RIDING HORSE/HACK AMATEUR OF THE YEAR**

Open to Hacks and Riding Horses. mare or gelding, 4 years old and over. Exceeding 148cms but Hacks not exceeding 160cms. Riders must have attained their 15th birthday by the day of the Show. Spurs may be worn by adult riders

Class 10* - YOUNG RIDERS (AMENDED FROM INTERMEDIATE SRT OR SHT)

Mare or gelding, exceeding 146cms but not exceeding 158cms. Riders not to have attained their 25th birthday before 1st January in the current year. Open to any type of horse – Hack, Hogged Cob, Traditional Cob, Riding Horse, Hunter or RoR. Horses will not be ridden by the Judge

Class 11 - TSR PLAITED PONY RIDDEN AMATEUR OF THE YEAR**

Open plaited pony, mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, not exceeding 153cms. Any suitably mounted rider. Spurs must not be worn

Class 12 - TSR FIRST RIDDEN PLAITED AMATEUR OF THE YEAR**

First Ridden Pony, mare or gelding 4 years old and over not exceeding 128cms. Riders to have attained their 3rd birthday but not their 10th birthday before 1st January in the current year. To be shown in any suitable bridle.

Class 13 - TSR LEAD REIN PLAITED RIDDEN AMATEUR OF THE YEAR**

Lead Rein Pony mare or gelding 4 years old and over not exceeding 128cms. Riders to have attained their 3rd birthday but not their 9th birthday before 1st January in the current year. To be led by an attendant and shown in a snaffle bridle. Lead rein to be attached to the noseband only.

Class 14* - BRHHS EVERSLEY RIDDEN HEAVY HORSES

Open to horses 4 years old and over that are registered in the main British Stud Books of the Shire, Clydesdale, Suffolk or Percheron Society at the time of qualification and must be entered in the name and ownership they are registered. Qualification to be awarded no lower than third place if the winning horse has already qualified. At shows where there is no Ride Judge a stand/individual show will be required. Riders will be required to give a short individual show at walk, trot & canter or set show lasting approximately 2 minutes. Change of rein and lengthened strides in trot and canter must be shown. Rein back, (optional) stand still and obedience to the leg. Horses should leave the ring at a walk or trot. Entries will not be asked to jump.

Class 15 - In-hand Youngstock.

Open to 1yr, 2yrs, 3yrs filly, colt or gelding

Class 16 - In-hand Novice.

Any age. Colt, Stallion, Filly, Mare or Gelding. Not to have been placed 1st in any Showing competition in the last calendar year

Class 17 - Ridden Novice.

Stallion, Mare or Gelding. Four years old and over. Not to have been placed 1st in any Showing competition in the last calendar year

Class 18 - In-hand Alternative Coloureds.

Any age. Colt, Stallion, Filly, Mare or Gelding. Open to any coloureds excluding piebald/skewbald e.g. Spotty, Dun, Palomino, Cremello

Class 19 - Ridden Alternative Coloureds.

Stallion, Mare or Gelding. Four years old and over. Open to any coloureds excluding piebald/skewbald e.g. Spotty, Dun, Palomino, Cremello

Class 20 - In-hand Foreign Breeds.

Any age. Colt, Stallion, Filly, Mare or Gelding.

Class 21 - Ridden Foreign Breeds

Stallion, Mare or Gelding. Four years old and over. Rider any age.

Class 22 - In-Hand Traditional Cob.

Any age. Colt, Stallion, Filly, Mare or Gelding.

Class 23 - Ridden Traditional Cob.

Stallion, Mare or Gelding. Four years old and over. Riders any age.

Class 24^ - Concours d'Elegance of Great Britain In-hand

Any age. Colt, Stallion, Filly, Mare or Gelding.



Class 25^ - Concours d'Elegance of Great Britain Ridden

Stallion, Mare or Gelding. Four years old and over. Riders any age.

Class 26 - Fancy dress.

Open to all, correct headgear and footwear must be worn by any mounted competitor

Class 27 - Pony Club / Riding Club Pony/Horse

Ponies/horses any height, four years old and over. To include a small jump

Class 28 - Best Lead Rein riders 10yrs & under

Ponies/horses any height, four years old and over

Class 29 - Best Turned Out.

In-hand or ridden. May be split if sufficient entries

Class 30 - Best Mane & Tail.

In-hand or ridden. May be split if sufficient entries

Class 40 - Tattersalls RoR OPEN In Hand Show Series Qualifier 2026

Open to all RoR and NR competition registered horses, 3yrs and over, fillies, mares and geldings. Handlers must be 15 years or over on the 1st of January 2025.

Horses do not need to be shod to compete in the RoR Open In-Hand class. Horses can be shown in a bitless/In-Hand Bridle. Blemishes caused by racing will be ignored.

All those entering horses and/or participating in the show agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force.

Handlers/grooms must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap.

The first three go forward to the final at The Jockey Club RoR National Championships at Aintree, August 22nd, 2026

Prizes – RoR rosettes 1st –4th plus Tattersalls RoR official merchandise voucher 1st £20, 2nd £10, 3rd £5, Highest placed Veteran (15+) £10

The Highest Placed Veteran also qualifies for the Tattersalls RoR Open In-Hand Veteran Show final at the Jockey Club RoR National Championships on August 22nd 2026

Class 41 - Tattersalls RoR AMATEUR Ridden Show Series Qualifier 2025

Open to all RoR and NR competition registered horses, 4yrs and over, mares and geldings, owned, produced and ridden by an Amateur. Riders must be 15 years or over on the 1st January 2026. Horses should be ridden in a snaffle, Pelham or simple double bridle with a plain cavesson noseband. Horses should be plaited.

Racing injuries and blemishes ARE IGNORED in this series.

The Series is open to AMATEUR riders only – those employed in racing will be allowed to compete. Class will be judged under 'riding horse' format without 'type' being taken into consideration. The Judge will not ride in the qualifiers but will ride in the Final. Competitors/grooms must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap.

The first three go forward to the final at the Hickstead Derby Meeting, June 21st 2026

Prizes – RoR rosettes 1st –4th + RoR Tattersalls official merchandise voucher 1st £20, 2nd £10, 3rd £5, Highest placed Veteran (15+) £10.

The winner also qualifies for the Tattersalls RoR Amateur Ridden Special at the Jockey Club RoR National Championships on August 22nd, 2026. Highest Placed Veteran qualifies for the RoR Ridden Veteran Final on August 22nd, 2026

Amateur definition:

The rules are as in the rulebook with the following addition that an amateur may not show a horse owned or sponsored by a company or commercial firm. In addition, a person classed as an amateur must not be supported by a company in any way or act as a brand ambassador whether financially or in-kind. An amateur is a person who for the purpose of RoR classes does not/has not during the current season or previous season:

Engage(d) in breeding, livery, buying or selling, dealing or hiring horses in commercial capacity. Horses must not have been stabled at or reside in a Professional Producer's/Trainer's yard from January 1st, 2025. Riders must not have ridden any animals produced by a Professional/Trainer in the current or previous season.

Horses and riders must not receive any help from a Professional Producer/Trainer at a SHOW in the current season. A rider who has ridden a Professional/Producer Trainer in the current or previous season must not have ridden horses at a show. Any breaches of this ruling will be taken seriously and will result in disqualification from future classes.

Class 42* - OPEN RE-TRAINED RACE HORSES

Thoroughbred mare or gelding, 4 years old & over, any height. Horses must have been raced in the GB to be eligible to compete. Riders any age.

Class 43* - The NPS/ABSORBINE M&M In-Hand Summer Championship (MM-IH)

These classes are open to pure bred registered M&M ponies in the main body of their studbook. Owner's membership cards must be shown in the ring to receive qualifications. Foals are not eligible.

Class 44 - The NPS/MOLE VALLEY FARMERS M&M Home Produced In Hand National Championship (MM-HPIH)

Please see NPS Rule Book, Sec A, 3.6. Please enter this class in the spirit it is intended. Competitors who contravene the above will be disqualified. Class may be split into Small Breeds / Large Breeds.

Class 45^* - The NPS/SHOWING CLASSICS M&M Leading Rein National Championship (MM-LR)

Open to mares and geldings four years old or over not exceeding 122 cm registered in the main body of their respective Breed Society stud book. Riders must have attained their 3rd birthday but must not have attained their 9th birthday before the 1st January in the current year. To be shown in a snaffle bit.

NPS/ WTJ Insurance Brokers Ltd Home Produced Ridden Championship Qualifier – wear white arm bands.

Class 46^* - The NPS/PARTRIDGE & PARR M&M First Ridden National Championship (MM-FR)

Open to mares and geldings four years old or over not exceeding 128 cm registered in the main body of their respective Breed Society stud book. Riders must have attained their 3rd birthday but not reached their 12th birthday before the 1st January in the current year.

NPS/ WTJ Insurance Brokers Ltd Home Produced Ridden Championship Qualifier – wear white arm bands.

NPS/Fiona Cork Saddles Young Rider Championship Qualifier – for rider up to 25 years

Class 47^* - The NPS/RINGSIDE STUD M&M Open Ridden National Championship (MM-OR)

Class will be split into small and large breeds -

47a - Dartmoor, Exmoor, Shetland, Welsh A, Welsh B

47b - Connemara, Dales, Fell, Highland, New Forest, Welsh C, Welsh D

Open to registered pure bred M&M stallions, mares and geldings five years old or over.

NPS/WTJ Insurance Brokers Ltd Home Produced Ridden Championship Qualifier– wear white arm bands.

NPS/Fiona Cork Saddles Young Rider Championship Qualifier – for rider up to 25 years

Class 48 - The NPS/PEASEDOWN STUD & JESS TALBOT M&M Intermediate Ridden National Championship (MM-IR)

Class will be split -

48a - Dartmoor, Exmoor, Shetland, Welsh A, Welsh B

48b - Connemara, Dales, Fell, Highland, New Forest, Welsh C, Welsh D

Open to pure bred registered M&M stallions, mares and geldings five years old or over

A pony is not eligible to compete if it has qualified before 1st January in the current year for:

- i) The M&M Open Ridden Championship final at Horse of the Year Show or
- ii) The M&M Supreme Ridden Championship final at London International Horse Show or
- iii) The M&M Open Ridden Championship Final at Royal International Horse Show

NPS/Fiona Cork Saddles Young Rider Championship Qualifier – for rider up to 25 years

Class 48 - The NPS/PICTON STUD M&M Novice Ridden National Championship (MM-NR)

48a - Dartmoor, Exmoor, Shetland

48b - Welsh A, Welsh B

48c - New Forest, Connemara

48d - Fell, Highland, Dales

48e - Welsh C, Welsh D

Open to pure bred registered M&M stallions, mares and geldings four years old or over.

A pony is not eligible to compete if, before 1st January in the current year, it has done any of the following:

i. Won an open affiliated mixed M&M Ridden class

ii. Qualified for Horse of the Year Show, LIHS or RIHS Open M&M Ridden classes

iii. Qualified for the M&M Novice or Intermediate Ridden final at the NPS Summer Championship show (N.B. Ponies can compete as novices in this competition for two consecutive years provided they do not submit an entry to the final in the first year).

iv. If a pony qualifies for Horse of the Year Show, LIHS or RIHS in its second year it is immediately de-noviced and cannot compete in the Picton Final.

Ponies must be shown in a snaffle bit.

NPS/Fiona Cork Saddles Young Rider Championship Qualifier – for rider up to 25 years

Class 50* - The NPS/COOPER FAMILY M&M Junior Ridden National Championship (MM-JR)

Class to be split -

50a - Open to registered Dartmoor, Exmoor, Shetland, Welsh Section A, Welsh Section B mares and geldings four years old and over. Riders must not have attained their 14th birthday before the 1st January in the current year.

50b - Open to registered Dales, Fell, Highland, New Forest, Connemara and Welsh Section C mares and geldings four years old and over. Riders must not have attained their 18th birthday before 1st January in the current year.

NPS/ WTJ Insurance Brokers Ltd Home Produced Ridden Championship Qualifier – wear white arm bands.

NPS/Fiona Cork Saddles Young Rider Championship Qualifier – for rider up to 25 years

NPS Silver Medal Rosette Championships: These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. NPS Silver Medal Rosettes are only awarded when the owner of the champion pony is a Qualifying or Life member of the NPS. A valid membership card must be in the rider's/handler's possession on entering the ring and be produced immediately on request by either the judge or the steward. If the owner of the Champion pony is not a member, or the owner's membership card is not immediately produced, the rosette may be awarded to the Reserve Champion provided they have the required membership card. If the Champion pony has previously qualified it is still entitled to the Silver Medal Rosette, but the qualification card goes to the Reserve Champion pony, provided the owner of that pony is a member of the NPS. The Silver Medal Rosette and the qualification card can be awarded no lower than first Reserve (third). Foals are not eligible for Silver Medal Championships.

Qualifiers are entitled to compete in the final of the Silver Medal Rosette Championship to be held at the NPS Summer Championship Show 4th – 6th August 2026.

Classes 47, 48, 49 and 50 are qualifiers for the Silver Medal Championship

Class 51 - NPS/NIPNA DALES PONY STUD M&M Ridden Silver Medal Rosette Championship (SM-MMR)

A Silver Medal Rosette is offered by the National Pony Society for the best registered pony owned by an NPS Qualifying or Life member in the M&M Ridden section (excluding Leading Rein, First Ridden & WHP). Membership cards must be presented in the ring to receive the medal and/or the qualification.

A pony can only attend one M&M Ridden Silver Medal Rosette Championship final in a season either at NPS Summer Championships at Malvern or at NPS Scotland Championships at Scone Palace. A pony may only take the qualification for the Silver Medal Final once in a season.

NPS Qualifying Rounds: These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. Ponies must be registered in any of the British Riding Pony studbook sections or the Ridden Register; the GSB; the AHSB; the AASB, or registered in the main body of their respective M&M Stud Book. Part breeds are not eligible unless over stamped into one of the British Riding Pony studbook sections or the Ridden Register.

Qualifying rounds for most NPS competitions are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non-members but only ponies owned by adult NPS Qualifying or Life members are eligible to qualify for the final of the competition at the NPS Summer Championship Show at Malvern from 5th – 7th August 2025. The highest placed pony, if owned by an NPS member, in each class will qualify for the final.

Qualification may pass down to third place if the first and second ponies are already qualified. NPS/WTJ Insurance Brokers Ltd Home Produced Ridden Championship - Riders of Home Produced ponies (see definition in the NPS Rules Book) can wear a white arm band in classes where this is indicated. These ponies, if owned by NPS members, are then eligible to qualify for the final at the NPS Summer Championship Show. The Owner's Membership cards MUST be produced in the ring when requested or the qualification will be forfeit.

Class 52^* - TSR RIDDEN COB AMATEUR OF THE YEAR

Open Ridden Cob, mare or gelding, 4 years old & over, exceeding 148cms but not exceeding 155cms. To be shown hogged and trimmed. Riders any age.

Class 53* - OPEN MAXI COBS

Open Maxi Cobs, mare or gelding 4 years old and over, exceeding 155cms – to be judged as a Cob. To be shown hogged and trimmed. Riders any age.

Class 54 - In-Hand Hunter Type.

Any age. Colt, Filly, Mare or Gelding. To exceed 148cms at maturity.

Class 55^* - TSR RIDDEN HUNTER AMATEUR OF THE YEAR

Open Ridden Hunter, mare or gelding, 4 years old and over. Exceeding 148cms. . Riders must have attained their 15th birthday by the day of the Show. Spurs may be worn by adult riders

Class 56* - OPEN SMALL HUNTERS

Open Small Hunter, mare or gelding, 4 years old & over, exceeding 148cms but not exceeding 158cms. Riders any age.

Class 57* - The NPS/Elite Coachworks & Horseboxes Ltd. M&M Novice Working Hunter Pony National Championship (MM-NWHP)

57a – Ponies not exceeding 122cms. Height of fences 45cm to 60cm

57b – Ponies exceeding 122cms but not exceeding 133cms. Height of fences 55cm to 65cm

57c – Ponies exceeding 133cms but not exceeding 143cms. Height of fences 65cm to 75cm

57d – Ponies exceeding 143cms but not exceeding 148cms (with the exception of Welsh Section D and Dales for which there is no height restriction). Height of fences 75cm to 85cm

Open to registered pure bred M&M stallions, mares and geldings, four years old or over. Ponies must be shown in a snaffle bit.

A pony is not eligible to compete if, before 1st January in the current year, it has done any of the following:

1. Won an open affiliated WHP class
2. Qualified for Horse of the Year Show or RIHS Open WHP classes
- iii) Qualified for the M&M Novice or Intermediate WHP final at the NPS Summer Championship show (N.B. Ponies can compete as novices in this competition for two consecutive years provided they do not submit an entry to the final in the first year).
- iv) If a pony qualifies for Horse of the Year Show or RIHS in its second year it is immediately de-noviced and cannot compete in the Novice WHP Final.
- v) Ponies that have won more than 5 BE points or 200 BS points, at home or equivalent abroad before 1st January in the current year, are not eligible to compete in novice working classes.

Class 58 - Lead Rein / First Ridden Working Hunter

Ponies not exceeding 128cm. Max height of fences 45cm

Classes 59 - 63 will be split pony / horse / racehorse / cobs / veterans if sufficient entries.

Class 59 - Working Hunter 60cm

Open to mares, geldings and stallions four year old and over.

Rules and Regulations

1. The organisers accept NO responsibility for any accident, loss or damage to any competitors, animals or property. It shall be a condition of entry that competitors will hold the organisers blameless and indemnify them against loss, damage or legal proceedings.
2. All competitors take part at their OWN RISK and are expected to always exercise due care and obey all notices displayed
3. The show recommends that all exhibitors should have adequate personal sports insurance
4. All accidents/incidents/falls should be reported to the Secretary
5. Where classes are affiliated the societies / associations rules apply
6. Exhibitors: Exhibitors may not knowingly exhibit any Horse/Pony that has been bred, sold, leased or produced the the Judge, or his/her immediate family or his/her employer, or from financial gain has been made in the last two years. Exhibitors may be asked to produce documentation if required. An exhibitor may not show and equine in a competitions class judged by any member of his/her immediate family, may not show under a judge for whom he/she has produced an equine within two years of the current year date, and may not ride in a class judged by someone for whom he/she has ridden in a competition within two years of the current year date. Exhibitors in both Ridden and In-Hand classes should wear NO face or body jewellery.
7. Equines: All Ridden Horses/Ponies MUST be 4 years old & over. All Colts / Stallions two years old & over must be in possession of a current license (unless otherwise governed by the individual Breed Society) and adequately bitted. All Stallions should wear 'Stallions badges' in all showing classes. In-hand Stallions / Colts may NOT be led by any Juniors who have not attained their 14th birthday before 1st January in the current year. Reins that restrict the natural movement of a horse/pony MUST NOT be used in the ring. Snaffle bridles only should be used in Lead Rein, First Ridden, Novice Ridden and Novice Working Hunter classes. 'Wilkie Bits' may not be used as Snaffles and may not be used as a part of a double bridle. Mountain & Moorland ponies must be shown in their natural state and trimming must comply with the respective Pure Breed Society Stud Books. Mares with foals at foot must have attained their 4th birthday. All foals being shown MUST be a minimum of three weeks old on the day of the show. No foals to be clipped, lunged or shown bitted. Mountain & Moorland foals must be eligible for entry into their respective Pure Breed Society Stud Books.
8. Equine Influenza: All equines should be vaccinated annually against Equine Influenza. We reserve the right to check passports of all equines attending the show at any time.
9. Riders/Handlers: Any pony stallions not exceeding 138cm or Small Breed Mountain & Moorland Stallions may NOT be ridden by juniors who have not attained their 12th birthday before 1st January in the current year. Stallions exceeding 138cm or Large Breed Mountain & Moorland Stallions may NOT be ridden by juniors who have NOT attained their 14th birthday before 1st January in the current year (unless otherwise governed by the individual Breed Society). Junior handlers of equines in all In-Hand classes, aged 14years & under should wear correctly secured current British Standard skull caps / riding hats. All children MUST have attained their 3rd birthday by 1st January in the current year before competing in any ridden classes and must comply with the upper limit of the class entered and be prepared to supply a copy of their birth certificate if requested. Riders MUST be within the correct age limits for the type of horse/pony ridden for the qualification to be valid. In Ridden classes, if a rider falls off at any time whilst in the ring, both horse/pony and rider MUST leave the ring, rider dismounted and take no further part in the class. Correct British Standard headgear must be worn at all times when mounted, with chinstraps correctly fastened.
10. Judges: The Judges' decision is final.
11. Welfare of Equines: If an equine is deemed to be mistreated in any way whilst at the show ground, the person/s responsible may be asked to leave the show ground and may be reported to the authorities. The show is also supporting appropriate size/weight of rider for the equine they are riding.
12. Behaviour: Behaviour by an exhibitor or his/her servants deemed unsporting or unreasonable, may be requested to leave the show ground. Any equine which in the opinion of the judge, is deemed out of control will be requested to leave the ring and/or the show ground. Any exhibitors or their servants seen using social media to air disputes will be requested to remove all their exhibits from the show ground and forfeit any entry fees paid. The organisers reserve the right to refuse entry of persons and/or equines at their discretion and without assigning a reason. All dogs MUST be kept on short leads at all times.
13. Objections: Objections must be in writing and given to the secretary within 30 minutes of the completion of the relevant class and accompanied with a fee of £50 (refundable if the objection is upheld)
14. Parents of children under 18 years of age: Parents should be aware that there will be official photographers at the show and if they do not want their children photographed they must make their own arrangements with the photographers. Only Official Photographers will be allowed in the rings.
15. Entry fees: Entry fees and associated fees are not refundable, except on receipt of a vet/medical certificate
16. No mucking out of horseboxes/trailers in the car park. No tying up of haynets outside lorries/trailers. Take your rubbish home.
